

3.1 Criteria for selection:

The Communities Representatives in the KCM in relation to the three diseases is an individual, while in the case of the NGO slot it organisational. However, institutional support is critical to carrying out the duties. The geographic coverage of the delegation member spans numerous counties and looks at community issues and needs of HIV, TB and malaria and how they affect communities. The selection of the ONE Representative and ONE Alternate will be based on the following criteria:

Criteria for Selection for Communities representatives to the KCM

To be eligible to apply to be a member of the KCM, on behalf of the communities of PLHIV, person affected by TB or Malaria, the individual must meet the following criteria:

- i. A person: –
 - a. Living with HIV; and/or
 - b. Living with or had Tuberculosis; and/or
 - c. Living in, or working with, communities affected by Malaria;
- ii. Be affiliated and nominated by an NGO that is compliant with the requirements of the NGO Board and working on any of the three diseases
- iii. Demonstrate some expertise and understanding of the scope of work of the Kenya Country Coordinating Mechanism, the Global Fund and the opportunities it presents, particularly relating to issues of people living with or affected by the three diseases
- iv. Be familiar with and able to articulate and advance the relevant aspect of the HIV, TB and Malaria National Strategic Frameworks.
- v. Ability to have access to consistent internet connection, email and phone services;
- vi. Ability to ensure continuous feedback to their constituencies based on information received at the KCM level;
- vii. Demonstrate linkages with community networks (local, county and national levels);
- viii. Demonstrate diplomatic and strategic political and negotiating skills to work with a variety of stakeholders;
- ix. Commitment to the National Principles and values set out in Article 10 and Chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya¹
- x. Openness, willingness and ability to learn, and the commitment to engage in issues of different constituencies;

- xi. Commitment to achieve the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) of the KCM;
- xii. Commitment to a minimum of five hours per week for Global Fund related activities;
- xiii. Commitment to adhere to the KCM governance documents, including Conflict of Interest (COI) plan;
- xiv. If employed by an organization, written assurance regarding the availability to attend KCM meetings and related assignments.

Criteria for Selection for NGO representative to the KCM

To be eligible to apply to be a member of the KCM, on behalf of the NGO's the organization must meet the following criteria:

- i. Be an NGO registered and working in Kenya and compliant with the NGO Coordination Board rules, regulations and requirements.
- ii. Have and share the organizations' current strategic plan
- iii. Have minimum five years of experience in front-line NGO work in one or more of the three disease areas (HIV, TB and Malaria) and other health related issues connected to the three diseases
- iv. Demonstrate expertise and understanding of the scope of work of the Kenya Country Coordinating Mechanism, the Global Fund and the opportunities it presents, particularly relating to issues of Civil Society Organisations in Kenya;
- v. Ability to articulate and advance the relevant aspect of the HIV, TB and Malaria National Strategic Frameworks that are aligned to the Country Concept Note.
- vi. Ability to have access to Consistent internet connection, email and phone services;
- vii. Ability to ensure continuous feedback to their constituencies based on information received at the KCM level and elsewhere
- viii. Demonstrated linkages with other NGOs & CBOs at the county and national levels
- ix. Commitment to the National Principles and values set out in Article 10 and Chapter 6 of the Constitution of Kenya Openness, willingness and ability to learn, and the commitment to engage in issues of different constituencies;
- x. Commitment to achieve the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) of the KCM;
- xi. Commitment to a minimum of five hours per week for Global Fund related activities;
- xii. Commitment to adhere to the KCM governance documents, including Conflict of Interest (COI) plan

Guidance for Nominating NGOs.

A nominating NGO can only provide one support letter to an interested nominee affiliated to that organization. No multiple representatives from an individual organization will be allowed. Each nominating organization will be required to provide their strategic plan for the current period in the disease specific area.
