PLHIV STIGMA INDEX 2.0 SURVEY TEAM

The National Empowerment Network of People living with HIV/AIDS in Kenya (NEPHAK) is a national 'Network' that unites people living with, at risk of and those affected by HIV and related co-infections and comorbidities through community-based organizations. Operating within the confines of the NGOs Coordination Act of 1990, NEPHAK aspires for a nation where people living with, at risk of and affected by HIV are at the forefront and meaningfully involved in the interventions geared towards an 'improved health and well-being of communities' and where their rights are recognized and respected. The network works to compliment the Ministry of Health and partners efforts aimed at delivering the 95.95.95 HIV Treatment targets so as to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030.
